SHAPE YOUR JOURNEY, HEAL OUR WORLD

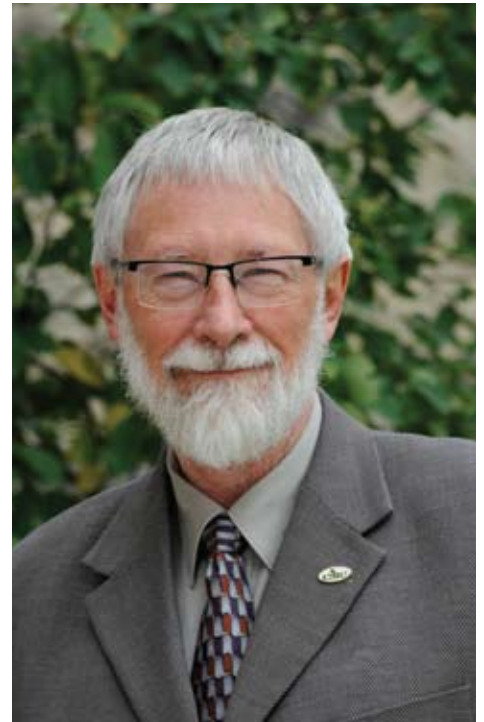
Each of us is on a journey. That is the reality of life. Our journey begins with birth, and ends with death. In between is what counts, for which we are responsible.

STRONG ACADEMICS

EXCEPTIONAL ACADEMIC COMMUNITY, DEDICATED TO INSPIRING A PASSION FOR LEARNING

CMU helps prepare you for a career or for further studies. As a member of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada, CMU provides you with opportunities to explore, engage, and increase your abilities as a critical and creative thinker.

Biblical and Theological Studies provides a disciplined, thoughtful reflection on the Bible, on the theological traditions and history of the church, and on the experiences and practices of Christian communities around the world. Develop skills to apply biblical and theological wisdom to contemporary personal and social issues or to prepare for a career in church ministry. Within this major, you can also focus on a Ministry Arts atreamp, which can effectively prepare you for specific ministries in the church including missions and service, worship or youth ministry. Many students who graduate with such concentrations successfully find ministry positions after graduation.

Biology is an important dimension in intellectual and personal development. The media regularly reports on things like avian flu, stem cell ethics, and intelligent design, among others. The study of biology at CMU broadens your understanding and expands your view of the world, aided by small class sizes and hands-on experience through CMU's modern new science lab. At CMU, we give you the opportunity to expand your horizons and explore the interaction of faith and science, and we provide opportunities for you to consider more career options, particularly in the medical and health care professions.

Business & Organizational Administration creates inspired, competent, and creative leaders—people whose character is shaped by their faith so they can be of service to church and society. Through this program, you can integrate faith and studies as you prepare for a career in business. *Students need high school calculus (or pre-calculus) to enter this program.*

Communications & Media prepares you to use faith-informed thinking to examine the ways society tells stories and communicates values. Develop skills you can use after university—the ability to write, interview, work with media, and do marketing and public relations. Your studies equip you to work in the church, world of business, and in non-profit organizations, applying your skills in writing, editing, design, broadcasting, and new technologies.

Disaster Recovery Studies helps you understand the nature of disasters, their aftermath, and the best ways to help people and communities recover physically, psychologically, socially, and spiritually. This program helps you develop analytic competencies and leadership qualities for working in disaster recovery and relief organizations or with other social service and volunteer organizations.

Economics at CMU focuses on assessing the strengths and weaknesses of the modern market economy to provide for the material needs and wants of the world, and also inquires

about how we can best participate in that economy. Studies in economics will prepare you for careers in business, financial services, government, and international organizations.

English gives you the tools you need to interpret works of fiction, non-fiction, and poetry and to communicate their interpretations effectively. The study and creation of imaginative literature makes a unique contribution to the examined Christian life by teaching sensitivity to metaphor and narrative. Learn to appreciate the power of language and understand what it takes to effectively communicate images, ideas, stories, and concepts. Prepare for careers demanding excellent communication and critical thinking skills, including journalism, media, business, law, publishing, church ministry, and teaching.

Geography concerns itself with physical and human interactions on the earth. Physical geography asks where and why natural phenomena occur as they do. Human Geography asks where and why human and cultural elements (including language, population, religion, agriculture, industry, and conflict) are located as they are. Studies in geography equip you to appreciate and care for creation and prepare you for a career in education, conservation, planning, or resource industries.

History enables you to understand various movements and influences that, throughout time, have shaped and formed the world in which you live. It helps you put your studies into context and see how what happened in the past affects life today. Studies in history can prepare you for a career in government, journalism, law, archival work, and education.

International Development Studies challenges you to explore the causes and consequences of wealth and poverty, prepare for citizenship in an increasingly interdependent global community, and develop skills to seek employment with international and local relief and development agencies. You will be challenged to envision paths toward a transformed, just world.

Mathematics assists in developing skills beneficial for many fields as you learn to be precise and organized, solve problems creatively, and reason analytically. CMU’s Christian worldview helps you consider the limitations and ethical applications of mathematics, how mathematics can inspire awe of the Creator, and how it has informed self-understanding and theology.



Music develops a strong foundation in history and theory along with practical music skills. Master music fundamentals and see how your studies meaningfully relate to church, school, and other settings. CMU's distinctive music program focuses on musical versatility, community involvement, and the integration of faith into a career. Concentrations include composition, music education, musicology, music administration, and music ministry. Career opportunities include conducting, education, performance, church music leadership, and composition and arrangement. Join in a wide variety of ensembles and small chamber groups tailored to your needs, interests, and talents.

Music Therapy teaches you to use music in a skilful, systematic way to promote positive changes in the mental, physical, emotional, or spiritual functioning of individuals and groups. CMU's program includes academic and clinical work culminating in an internship at an approved facility.

Peace and Conflict Transformation Studies builds understanding of the nature and dynamics of human conflict and offers alternative ways of dealing with conflict— ways that develop healthy relationships and prevent violence. Through your studies, you can better understand and interact constructively with personal, local, and global conflict situations.

Philosophy allows you to deal with basic questions such as: What is real? What can I know? What should I do? Of special interest is how this relates to Christian faith. Studies in philosophy will equip you with skills essential for many pursuits, including careers in post-secondary education, law, government, policymaking, and administration.

Political Studies addresses power and inequalities among people, communities, and states. Examine obstacles to fostering God's kingdom on earth. Explore how the state, technologies, bodies of knowledge, and practices of culture and citizenship facilitate or compromise the goals of justice, peace, and human dignity.

Psychology allows you to explore the many facets of human experience, from development, learning, and memory to social interactions and the physiological underpinnings of these phenomena. It allows you to critically consider the various points of contact between psychology and faith. Skills useful in counselling, teaching, business, ministry, or higher-level study will be fostered.

Social Sciences focuses on: Counselling Studies, preparing you for further study in counselling or therapy; Intercultural Studies, which will increase your intercultural competencies and sensitivities for future study, work, service, and peacemaking; and Social Service, giving you knowledge and skills for future work and service in public and non-profit human service and social welfare organizations.

Sociology covers topics such as culture, socialization, groups and organizations, social processes, community, social stratification, social change, religion, and family. You will be challenged to think about how faith and beliefs are shaped by society and how you in turn can shape society.

PRE-PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS

At CMU, you can take pre-professional courses that prepare for additional studies leading to careers in Agriculture, Architecture, Business, Education, Human Ecology, Law, Medicine, Medical Rehabilitation, Nursing, Physical Education and Recreation Studies, and Social Work.

PRACTICUM PROGRAM

Satisfy your intellectual curiosity, be challenged academically, grow spiritually, develop new skills and abilities, and test your career interests through CMU's practicum program. It's a great way to find out who you are and what you should do with your life. Practicum assignments can be done during the school year, the summer, or over the course of a year. They can be done locally, in North America, or around the world.



“Real learning often derives not from what we actually do but simply from our openness to receive. When I was doing my practicum in the rural village of Olepolos, in Kenya, I learned about Maasai culture by being invited into the kitchen each night, as the women cooked by lantern light over a charcoal stove. I learned about pastoralism by walking with my host brothers as they led their sheep through the bush. And I learned about social change by listening to the elders as they recounted local history over copious amounts of creamy, sugary tea. It is these experiences that show me how little my education was of my own doing, and how much it was given to me through unprecedented acts of generosity and hospitality.”

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Graduates Studies reflect CMU's mission to inspire and equip women and men for lives of service, leadership, and reconciliation in church and society. Faculty members specialize in biblical, historical, theological, and practical studies. Programs offer diversity, flexibility, and interdisciplinary engagement in an Anabaptist, evangelical, and ecumenical setting. CMU also offers programs in cooperative partnerships with several other theological schools.

Master of Arts in Theological Studies & Master of Arts in Christian Ministry provide graduate-level education for people who want to nurture their capacity for theological reflection and the intersection of learning and life. It is of special interest to those who want to prepare for a graduate program (PhD) in biblical or theological studies in preparation for an academic career, or to explore and strengthen their capacities for ministry.

OUTSTANDING FACULTY

CMU courses are taught by outstanding and dedicated faculty. Over 80 percent of full-time faculty hold doctoral degrees from well-known universities. These professors are both passionate about the subjects they teach, and care about the people they teach. They are committed to seeing you succeed and grow academically, personally, and spiritually. Many CMU faculty have lived in other countries, bringing an international flavour to campus along with broadened perspectives on the world.



CLASSROOM SIZES

An important aspect of a good educational experience is classroom size. At CMU, the average classroom size is 21, creating opportunities for meaningful interaction with other students and professors.

LIBRARY

CMU's library has over 108,000 items (books, periodicals, CDs) with extensive electronic resources available online and in CD format. CMU offers reciprocal borrowing privileges, enabling students to also use libraries at other local colleges and universities.

CMU ATHLETICS

The CMU Athletics Program develops excellence through highly competitive intercollegiate sports.

CONSIDER CMU ATHLETICS

As a Christian university, CMU acknowledges the role that a competitive athletics program plays in a student-athlete's university success and experience. We are committed to helping our athletes pursue athletic excellence as well as academic distinction in the classroom while at the same time effectively nurturing emotional, social, and spiritual strength and maturity.

COMPETITIVE CONFERENCE PLAY

CMU is a member of the Manitoba Colleges Athletics Conference (MCAC) which is comprised of eight universities and colleges in Manitoba and Minnesota. CMU competes in women's and men's soccer, women's and men's volleyball, and women's and men's basketball. CMU offers annual tournaments involving college and university teams in western Canada, Ontario, and parts of the United States.



GREAT FACILITIES

The Loewen Athletic Centre, located on the north side of CMU's Shaftesbury Campus, is the home of the CMU volleyball and basketball teams. With an electric atmosphere on game nights, our gymnasium offers athletes a great playing experience. The varsity athletics field is located on the south side of Shaftesbury Campus and is the home of the CMU soccer teams. The CMU fitness room, adjacent to the Loewen Athletic Centre, provides student-athletes daily access to weights, exercise machines, and cardio equipment.

GENEROUS AWARDS PROGRAM

CMU Merit Awards and Leadership Scholarships recognize CMU students who are gifted in specific areas, including athletics. CAMPUS VISITS

FULLY ACCREDITED

CMU was chartered as a university by the Province of Manitoba in 1998. In October 2008, CMU became a member of the Association of Universities and Colleges in Canada (AUCC). Thus, the work students do at CMU is recognized by other universities in Canada and beyond.



Winnipeg is a culturally rich and diverse city of over 700,000 people located in the heart of Canada. It is known for the arts (symphony, theatre, ballet, art galleries); sports (football, hockey, and baseball); and music (all varieties, including being home to one of Canada's oldest and largest annual folk festivals). CMU is located in southwest Winnipeg, about 20 minutes from downtown, beside a large urban forest and near to Assiniboine Park—Winnipeg's largest park.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION



CMU SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

Each year, CMU awards over \$350,000 in financial student aid through its scholarships, bursaries, and grants.

Scholarships and Merit Awards

Entrance Scholarships are given to all students who apply for CMU admission with an academic entering average of 80% or higher. Four Leadership Scholarships (worth \$10,000 each) and six Program Merit Awards (worth \$3000 each) are also given each year. Transfer students are also eligible for Academic Entrance Awards.

Church Matching Grants

CMU also matches money given to students by their churches up to \$500 (\$1000 for US students). Ask an Admissions Counsellor how you can be eligible to receive this money.

Bursaries

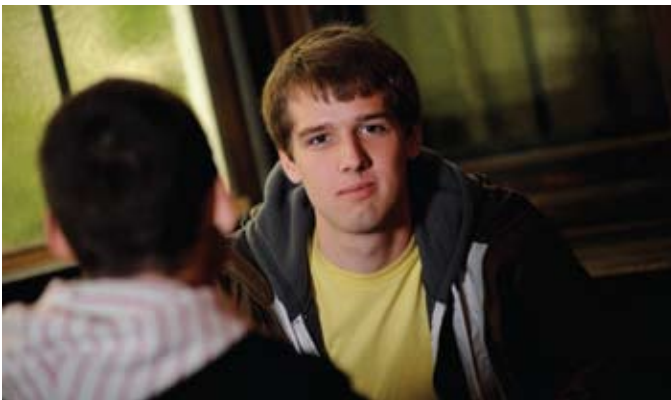
Each October enrolled students with financial need can apply for bursary money.

Loans

As students in a fully-accredited university recognized by AUCC, CMU students are eligible to receive Provincial Student Loans from all Canadian provinces and Federal Student Loans from both Canada and the US.

Campus Jobs

CMU offers a variety of jobs where students can work up to five hours/week to earn up to \$500 per semester.



ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

To study at CMU, you need to meet the University's admission requirements indicated below. International students must meet the admission requirements for university in their home countries or have successfully completed an internationally examined curriculum. International students whose first language is not English must also demonstrate a proficiency in English.

ALBERTA Five Grade 12 subjects at the 30-level, including English 30, with a minimum grade of 60% in each subject.

BRITISH COLUMBIA Grade 12 in a university entrance program with a minimum grade of C, or 60%, in English and in each of three additional provincially examinable courses. (Provincial examinations, however, are not required, unless they are mandatory to meet BC graduation requirements.)

MANITOBA Candidates must be high school graduates who satisfy the Manitoba Education and Training senior (1-4) high school program. Candidates for admission to CMU must present at least five full Senior 4 Specialized (S), General (G), or Dual Credit - University (U) credits. Three of these must be academic subjects, with a minimum overall average of 65%, including one full credit in English 40S with a minimum grade of 60%.

Applicants should note that several courses or programs at CMU have prerequisites in mathematics and/or science, including courses in chemistry, mathematics, and statistics, and majors in Business and Organizational Administration, Mathematics, and Psychology. A limited number of candidates who do not meet these requirements may be admitted with conditional status.

NEW BRUNSWICK A New Brunswick Secondary School Diploma with a minimum grade of 60% in English and in each of four other grade 12 courses at the 120-, 121-, or 122-level.

NEWFOUNDLAND High School graduation and a minimum average of 70% in ten 300-level subjects. English Language 3101 and one of Thematic Literature 3201 or Literary Heritage 3202 must be included in this average.

NORTHWEST TERRITORIES Grade 12 with a minimum grade of 60% in English 30 and in each of four other 30-level subjects.

NOVA SCOTIA Five academic and/or advanced grade 12 subjects, including English with a minimum average of 70%.

NUNAVUT Grade 12 in a university entrance program with a minimum grade of 60% in English 30 and in each of four other 30-level subjects.

ONTARIO Ontario Secondary School Diploma with a minimum grade of 60% in each of six 4U or 4M courses, including English 4U.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND Grade 12 in a university preparatory program with a minimum grade of 65% in English and in Mathematics and in each of three academic electives.

QUÉBEC First year CEGEP (12 credits including English) with satisfactory standing (a minimum GPA of 2.0 or an average of at least 60%), or a Québec Senior High School Leaving Certificate with satisfactory standing in six subjects including English.

SASKATCHEWAN Grade 12 in a university entrance program with a minimum grade of 65% in each of five 30-level subjects, including: English Language Arts 30A and 30B.

YUKON TERRITORY Grade 12 in a university entrance program with a minimum grade of C (60%) in Grade 12 English and in each of three other approved provincially examinable courses. (Provincial examinations, however, are not required, unless they are mandatory to meet graduation requirements.)

Community College Students with a minimum of one year of a two-year diploma program and a minimum "C" average may apply for admission as regular students.
